2025 Watch Year Education Planning – Jeff Schmitt

Our Education Officer, Jeff Schmitt, has presented a 2025 training plan with the hope of involving several members to engage the boating public. Tentative offerings, subject to instructor resources, are as follows:

America's Boating Course, 3rd Edition (ABC3) would be offered 4 times this spring. Each class would tentatively have three Friday evening sessions (7:00 to 9:00 pm). The sessions would cover: (1) Chapters 1-2; (2) Chapters 3-4 and (3) knots, a review and final exam.

Boat Handling Course (BH) would be offered; the number of classes is yet to be determined. This class is for students who have successfully completed a certified boating safety class (e.g., ABC3, TWRA-administered or USCG Auxiliary-administered). Successful completion of the BH course earns ABC members the advanced grade of "S." The class would tentatively have six Saturday morning sessions (9:00 am to noon). The sessions would cover:

A combination ABC3 and BH class would also be offered for those students who haven't completed a certified boating safety course (USPS requires having successfully completed a boating safety course as a prerequisite in obtaining a certificate for successfully completing the BH course.) Our club will market ABC3 and BH as a combined course with a \$75 price. The price includes a student ebook (.pdf format), the in-class sessions, and access to online lessons. This combination offering would tentatively have Saturday morning sessions (9:30 am to noon).

Additional marketing would welcome students to attend any session for free as a recruiting strategy for students who might not be ready to commit to the entire class. This gives them the opportunity to see what we are teaching and hopefully decide to take the full class. All education opportunities are opportunities for our club to recruit members.

On-water training supplements continue:

- **Lock-through training** would be similar to past years. The proposed schedule is May 10 for training initiated at Ft Loudon Marina and May 17 for training initiated at Tennessee National.
- **Supplemental training as it pertains to ABC3 and BH** would be scheduled for Saturday afternoons with participants encouraged to bring their own boats.

Marine Navigation (MN) would be offered; the number of classes is yet to be determined. This class is for students who have successfully completed the BH course. Successful completion of the MN course earns ABC members the advanced grade of "P." Each class will consist of six online modules and a practice cruise. The examination is done online; it covers the material in the student ebook and the practice cruise. Students will need to register for the online course. Also, the class will meet in-person for 2-hour sessions. Students bring their laptops for the OpenCPN sessions. The in-person sessions will coach the practice cruise.

Our club will market this course with a \$75 price. A list of the chapters in the course are on the next page.

Updates on Courses and Seminars – John Farmer

Boating on Rivers, Locks and Lakes (BRLL) Seminar – the effort to update this seminar has been discontinued. During the development phase of the update, the USPS Navigation Committee (NavCom) realized there was too much information to present in a 2-hour seminar. As a result, a decision was made to expand the material to encompass everything you need to know when boating on inland waters. The current seminar will remain in the catalog until the new course is released.

John Farmer, who is our District Education Officer and is a NavCom member was the one who rewrote the Boating on Locks and Lakes portion for the seminar. He also has written the Inland chapter on Navigable Waters. John states that the ***BRLL Seminar is valuable for our boating...and if you have not already done so, please purchase and download it now!***

Inland Boating (IB) Course is currently in progress. The topics covered include the definition of inland boating, cruise planning, charts, weather, navigation rules and aids, river boating (with a detailed discussion of commercial traffic operations), the Automatic Identification System, locking through (featuring a new 5-minute video), bridges, lake boating, human-powered vessels, and transporting your vessel.

The course addresses the essentials of boating on inland rivers and lakes (excluding the Great Lakes) in the United States. Inland rivers (aka U.S. Western Rivers or the Inland Waterway System) are the navigable waters from the Great Lakes to the Gulf of Mexico. Boating on inland waters can involve various time frames (i.e. day trips to multi-week excursions). The course is planned to be offered as an elective with multiple seminars. Successful completion of all seminars (either by attending the classes or testing out) will earn the student the IB designator. The projected release date of the Beta version is fall 2025.

Cruising Under Power and Sail (CUPS) Course. This updated and revised course is ready for prime time. I have now reviewed the first chapter of the Cruising Under Power and Sail (CUPS) course. ***If there is enough interest, John Farmer is willing to offer the first chapter online as a free seminar. Interested members should contact John via email at captfarmer@gmail.com.***

- Ch1 – Preparing to Cruise. This section includes Cruising types; Destination selection; Season & length; Collecting information; Cruising guides; Tourist bureau websites; and Cruise planning checklist.
- Ch2 – A Boat for Cruising. This section includes: Why, who, what, when, where; Chartering vs. buying; Ownership; Powerboats; Sailboats; and Evaluating a boat.
- Ch3 – Propulsion & Electrical Systems. This section includes: Engine systems; Propulsion systems; DC electrical systems; AC electrical systems; and Tools & spare parts.

Education Dept – Technical Corner – John Farmer

Night Vision Option for Boaters - If you boat at night, you should have radar, but even that can't see all the river debris. Now, there is a less expensive and easier-to-use option with a color, night vision optic, from Sionyx at <https://www.sionyx.com/products/aurora-pro>.



When John Farmer captained THE STAR, he installed a more expensive FLIR grayscale thermal vision camera aboard her; so the bridge could see standup paddleboarders out at night without lights. Thermal vision can see bridges and things beyond them better than radar.

Fisherman Outreach – Feedback Requested – John Farmer

Top 10 USA boating activities based on general participation, with estimated participation percentages. These participation percentages are based on surveys conducted by the National Marine Manufacturers Association (NMMA) and other boating-related research organizations.

1. Fishing – 40%
2. Cruising/Leisure Boating – 20%
3. Water Sports (Water Skiing, Wakeboarding, Tubing) – 15%
4. Canoeing/Kayaking – 12%
5. Sailing – 10%
6. Stand-Up Paddleboarding (SUP) – 7%
7. Scuba Diving/Snorkeling – 5%
8. Boating Events/Regattas – 4%
9. Boat Camping – 3%
10. Personal watercraft operation – 2%

“How to Use GPS” Seminar for Fishermen - It seems that all fishermen use GPS chartplotters. So, John Farmer suggests a free seminar, “How to use GPS.” This seminar introduces students to the basics of how to use GPS. Topics include: setup and status, using your GPS, and boat systems integration. John observed that his Lowrance plotter defaults to recording his tracks. At a marina, he saw a bass boater that had so many overlapping tracks that it was hard to read the chart. John showed him how to delete tracks and turn track recording off. And John gave the fisherman contact information about our club.
