

Dinner Presentation by the Schmitts – 2/25/2025 (continued)

In reality the joys that bedeck cruising come with hard lessons. Boats and Mother Nature are ruthless teachers. Windy cold weather challenges our readiness to be at sea. Dangerous lightning and breaking waves (and big wakes) kindle our natural desire to survive. Failing or faulty equipment turn us into technical sleuths. But those uncomfortable or stress-filled situations give greater perspective as to what is joy.

Some takeaways that were punctuated with pics were:

- Stow everything to be ready for those waves and wakes
- Storm management includes deciding when it's best to ride it out at anchor
- Use more dock lines to secure your boat when high winds are forecast – but also remember to not trip over them. Ouch!
- Know your bottom when running aground; you might be able to free your boat yourself.
- Know your air draft and the tide and be very cautious to avoid adorning bridges with your stuff.
- Attach your state decal; let the marine police pursue other boaters.
- Be aware that you could be boarded, you might need assistance at sea and you could be medevac'd.
- Never tell friends that you will meet them on a particular date or place. Weather will get in the way.
- Carry ALL required safety equipment (and a lot more).
- Know the state of the tide and resulting current
- Even sailboats need fuel; double check that you are topped off before departure
- When chartering, be prepared to handle possible engine issues. Are there spare parts aboard? Could you install them?
- Do you know your boat's power consumption rate and is your system adequate?
- Are you prepared to safely navigate in fog and at night?
- Have you adequately prepared your boat for freezing conditions?
- Did you file a float plan and did you contact the loved one who is tracking your progress, so that the authorities aren't looking for you?

Of course, this presentation served only as a “primer” [At right Barbie works on bottom paint]. As SEO, Jeff is taking orders for USPS elective courses!

To become an examiner, you must take an on-line class, pass a 60-question test and inspect 5 boats over-seen by a certified examiner. The Rossini Festival is Knoxville Opera's annual International Street Fair that celebrates the global impact on the music, food, art, and culture of East Tennessee. Throughout the festival, the public is treated to non-stop entertainment on four outdoor stages showcasing opera, classical, jazz, gospel, ethnic music, ballet, modern, and ethnic dance. Attendees can purchase from scores of food vendors and more than 75 artisans throughout the day, while The Y FunZone keeps children entertained. More than half a million residents of Knox County and the surrounding area have enjoyed the Rossini Festival over the years.

The Treasurer's files were audited January 10 and passed the review.


Vessel Examiner's Report

The increasing cost of subscription makes it important to check what is out there. Each year there is something new.

USPS recently announced (2/20/2025) a new partnership with DITCH—a smart navigation app for boaters. Here's how Ditch makes your boating experience better:


- **Route planning:** DITCH's Smart Path™ technology uses billions of recent data points to provide the optimal route for your journey. Use it as a planning tool or live on the water.

- Class 1: Sessions are March 14, 21 and 28

Spring Checklist – excerpt from BoatingCompass.org (USPS)

Using a spring checklist for boaters like the one below will help you start the boating season on a positive note.

- **Documents:** Review your license, registration, insurance and other important documents pertaining to your boat and trailer, and store them in a watertight bag or container.
- **Life jackets:** Make sure each person has a properly sized life jacket in good condition with no rips or missing parts.
- **Fire extinguishers:** Make sure onboard fire extinguishers are fully charged, properly mounted and the correct class for your vessel. Turn dry chemical extinguishers upside down to loosen the powder. Replace or refill expired units.
- **Visual Distress Signaling Device.** Make sure onboard .
- **Charts:** Review and update as necessary.
- **Plugs:** Inspect and tighten drain plugs. Make sure rubber seals or gaskets haven't cracked or dried out in storage.
- **Hoses and clamps:** Inspect and replace as necessary.
- **Propellers:** Inspect for dings, pitting, cracks and distortion. Damaged props can cause unwanted vibration and drive train damage. Make sure connectors such as cotter pins are secure, and move the prop back and forth to check for looseness. If the shaft is loose, consider replacing the bearing.
- **Inboards:** Examine the rudderstock to ensure it has not been bent or compromised.
- **Hull:** Inspect for blisters, distortions, cracks and compromised rivets.
- **Water intake strainer:** Make sure your strainer is secure, unobstructed and corrosion-free.
- **Large inboards:** Check the engine shaft and rudder stuffing boxes for looseness before and after launch. Make sure through-hulls don't leak.
- **Outboards and outdrives:** Inspect outdrive bellows for cracks, dryness or deterioration, paying careful attention to the folds. Replace questionable bellows.
- **Fluid levels:** Check all fluid levels, including engine oil, power steering and power trim reservoirs. Replace worn-out zincs.
- **Control cables:** Inspect the outer jackets, and replace cables showing cracks, swelling, corrosion or deterioration.
- **Fuel lines:** Inspect fuel lines, including fill and vent hoses, for softness, brittleness or cracking.
- **Fuel tanks:** Check your tanks and pumps, and replace filters annually. Consider using a fuel stabilizer.
- **Hoses:** Inspect cooling, exhaust and blower hoses and pipes for stiffness, rot and leaks. Make sure hoses are connected tightly; double clamp them if necessary.
- **Electrical connections:** Inspect for cleanliness and tightness. Corrosion, especially on battery cables, could indicate a poor connection. Remove the terminals, and wire brush them along with the cable ends.
- **Running and navigation lights:** Make sure all running lights work. Keep spare navigation bulbs on board.
- **Emergency lights:** Inspect emergency lights and signal devices, and make sure you have spare batteries.
- **Engine cutoff switch:** Ensure it's working properly.
- **Bilge pumps:** Check for leaks and corrosion, and make sure the float switch works.
- **Ropes and lines:** Inspect for damage, chafing and deterioration, and replace as necessary. Pay out and thoroughly inspect your anchor line. Keep lines untangled and coiled for ease of use.

This list should only be used as a starting point. Add or delete items to suit your boat and trailer requirements.
