Last Port of Call – Watts Bar and Hiwassee River Cruise

As reported by the Commander, we had an invitation-only, private event that had as its goal to reach and eat at B&B Marina (B&B is located at 35 19.658N, 084 49.731W (street address is 117 Marina Drive NW, Charleston, TN 37310).

Measured from our assembly point at TN National Marina, the round trip was 170+ miles plus locking through at Watts Bar. For our boats that were on Fort Loudon and Tellico Lakes, they had about another two days of travel (round trip) and as much as another 50+ miles. So this could be considered the longest cruise for several boats this year. All were watching the forecasts and fortunately Knoxville meteorologists got it



wrong. Clouds threatened but we were often dry. The worst was when Time After Time (the Hansons) and Next Chapter (the Fendleys) were downbound on 9/25 at the confluence of the Tennessee and the Clinch. The heavens opened and visibility dropped for about a half hour to less than 100 yards. The eisenglass biminis were worth the



investment. Rain also happened the next day at B&B, but it was after all were secured at the dock.

Next Port of Call – Tellico Lake Cruise (Private Event)


The planned Ish Creek outing has been replaced by a cruise within Tellico Lake. This will take advantage of the early fall colors and hopefully avoid crowds of day boaters. We thank Don Perrine for being the Event Captain for this private, invitation-only outing. Those on the standing invitation list have been notified by email of this event. They will need to RSVP to Don as noted below. Other members who have an interest who haven't expressed interest in participating in boating events may also RSVP to Don as noted below.

The itinerary for this outing is:

Monday, October 13	RAFT UP in the afternoon and spend the night at the cove located between Jackson Bend Island on Tellico between the small boat pass and Lotterdale Cove Campground's south side, which is 10.5 miles from the start of Tellico Lake at the route 321 highway bridge.
Tuesday, October 14	Cruise 13 miles to Notchy Creek off the Tellico River. We can do a STAR RAFT UP if there are enough boats, otherwise a conventional raft up could be done.
Wednesday, October 15	Cruise up the Tellico River 10 miles to Ballplay area to spend the afternoon and ANCHOR overnight.
Thursday, October 16	Cruise to Tellico Yacht Club to have dinner at the restaurant and SPEND THE NIGHT AT THE DOCK.
Friday, October 17	Return home.

USPS financial information is reported regularly at both Governing Board meetings, and the audit of the organization is sent to any member when requested, after it is completed each year. This is in accordance with longstanding practices and North Carolina law. Reports by the Treasurer and other officers at the meetings provide context on the financial information presented. USPS has taken additional steps to maintain and strengthen USPS's commitment to responsible financial management and open communication with our members. To further enhance transparency, **USPS now publishes quarterly financial reports on the Treasurer's website**. Got to www.usps.org. If a member has a question about the posted report, they should contact the National Treasurer for clarification. The Board continues to monitor cash receipts and expenditures and adjusts the budget accordingly.

NATIONAL NEWS – Save Our Squadrons “SOS” Report

The “SOS” REPORT was released 9/1 – It served to focus discussion at this year’s National Governing Board meeting. The attached report was published to give succinct answers to the following questions. **Members are encouraged to scan this easy-to-read attachment.**

1. Who is the Governing Board?
2. Are the Governing Board members entitled to transparency of USPS/ABC in financial operations?
3. Is there transparency to the Governing Board in USPS/ABC financial and Governance Affairs?
4. What is the current financial condition of USPS/ABC?
5. What does the 2024 Audit show?
6. What is the financial plan for USPS/ABC?
7. What is the USPS/ABC Strategic Plan?
8. What steps can the Governing Board take to help save USPS/ABC?

NATIONAL NEWS – Governing Board Outcome

The National Governing Board (GB) Meeting was attended by John and Jeanette Farmer. We thank John for providing the following reports.

The following decisions were made. They are mostly in response to the “SOS” Report.

- Increase the number of GB delegates per squadron from 1 per 100 members to 1 per 50 for broader representation. This was referred to the rules committee.
- Require the GB to submit a strategic plan at the next annual meeting in February.
- Require the GB to submit a financial plan that supports the strategic plan. This motion was amended to require the financial plan to be submitted one year after the strategic plan is approved.

The following observations were made about the boating public.

- Very few, if any, power boats under 50 feet with a cabin are produced today. People are either taking short one-day out-and-back trips or out-and-back trips with a hotel night stay
- An increasing number of people do not own a boat but belong to a boat lending club, where nighttime use is not allowed.
- Sailboats over 20 feet typically have a cabin; they make up 10% of the boat market
- Paddle craft are on the rise.

The following observations were made about boating education.

- Eighty percent of USPS courses are now taken online.
- USPS encourages squadrons to promote offerings as early as possible online (via its HQ800 system) so others can find them. A woman in California recently completed a course taught in Annapolis; we can do the same.

Impact On Our Squadron (Opinion) – Keep Calm and Carry On

Given the crisis at the National level, our Bridge members have been assessing what course of action we might pursue. In the near term, District staff encourage squadrons to “hang tight” and continue to function as before. We are doing that. Keep Calm and Carry On!

Our Bridge is also researching options should the crisis affect future squadron operation. Opinions are that our club should be resilient and continue to offer value to our boating community. Items that surfaced from the initial look-see were:

1. Our squadron will likely retain its 501(c)(3) status.
2. With our treasury, we might acquire all of the current training materials offered by USPS, so that we can make use of those resources for boater education in our locale.
3. We would need to address insurance concerns

Educational Department Technical Corner by John Farmer



AQUA MAP – The navigation app company has a new, free navigation training program. I have just been notified that I have been approved as an instructor so I can see what they have.



ORCA – Somehow, I missed ORCA (<https://getorca.com/>). Orca navigation has been on the market since 2020, when the brand was founded by Norwegian, German, and Spanish enthusiasts. As of April 2025, Orca has grown to over 300,000 active users in just five years. I now have their free app on my tablet and have tested river (properly follows the sailing line) and ocean automatic routing. I can apparently download their charts for \$45 per year.

They have a Core2 navigation interface for \$599. It connects to your onboard devices via NMEA2000 and Ethernet (for radar and eventually NMEA One Net). It adds better GPS accuracy, autopilot control, and precision compass. This can interface with up to five devices like tablets, phones, Mac, and watches.



They offer a marinized Samsung, Android, daylight-bright tablet display for \$999 (outside my budget).

I am going to consider adding the Core2 to a Neel 47 trimaran that my son and I are trying to locate and purchase.

Orca supports the devices shown below. It's over-the-horizon AIS is derived from satellite data...great for offshore, but apparently it doesn't acquire inland data.
